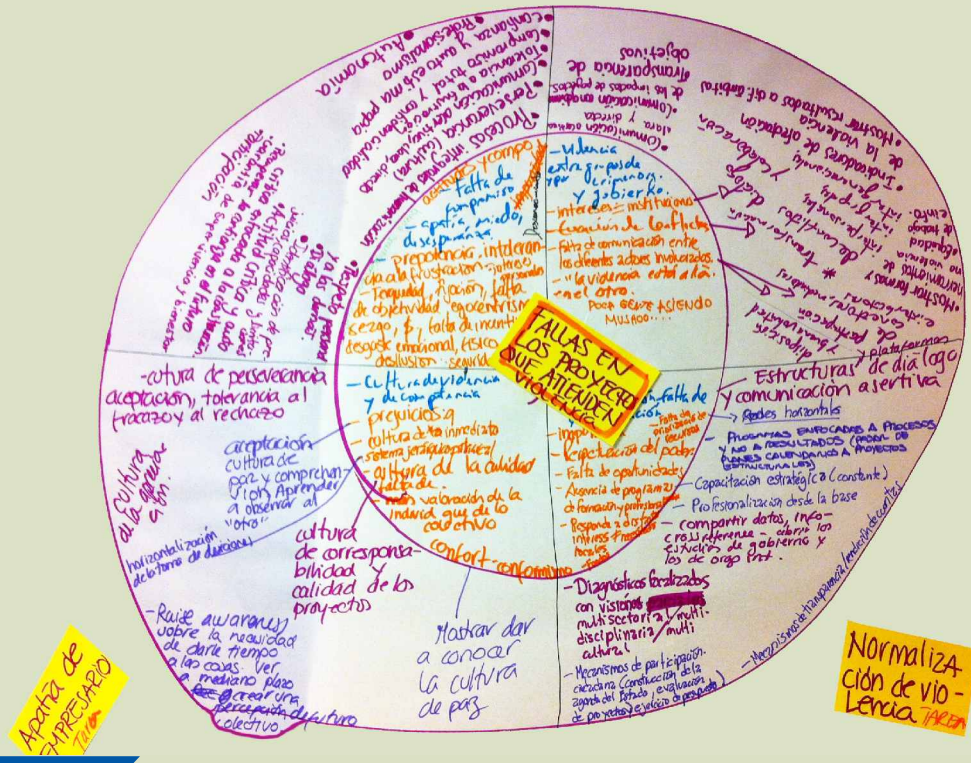

ABOUT PATRIR

Over the past 12 years PATRIR has become one of the world's leading centres for the support of peacebuilding and peace operations and training and capacity building for practitioners and experts in the field. As host to the International Peace and Development Training Centre (IPDTC) it has provided training in peacebuilding and related fields to more than 3000 participants from over 60 countries, both at the Global Centre in Romania and upon request world-wide. Through its Department of Peace Operations (DPO), PATRIR is engaging in strengthening infrastructure for peace (I4P) and support for peace operations, violence prevention, and post-war peace consolidation, reconciliation and healing around the world, including in Nepal, Mexico, Cyprus, Crimea-Ukraine, Moldova-Transdniestria, Lebanon, Iraq, Israel-Palestine and elsewhere.

Through its Department for Education for Peace and Development (DEPD), PATRIR engages in peace education programs in schools and in the community of Cluj-Napoca and with partners internationally. PATRIR also supports global campaigns for peace and against violence, helping to organise them locally and nationally in Romania, including the '16-Day campaign against violence against women', One Billion Rising, and many more.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT

In 2013 the International Peace and Development Training Centre (IPDTC) has continued the steady consolidation and expansion of programmes started in 2012.

The Executive Leadership (ELP) and Advanced Certificate (ACP) programmes held in partnership with the London based Engi and US based Peace Operation Training Institute (POTI) has widened the Center's Alumni group with 132 of experts and practitioners engaged in violence and post-violence settings. As the highlight of the past training calendar, we may mention the "People Building Peace. Designing Peacebuilding Strategies: Making Real Change Happen" workshop held in June 2013 in Istanbul, addressed to NGO representatives from two major conflict areas of the Caucasus: Georgia / Abkhazia, Georgia / South Ossetia and Armenia, Azerbaijan & Nagorno Karabakh. The workshop focused on developing the capacity of participants to transform peacebuilding planning into peacebuilding action with sustainable results.

During the course of last year, IPDTC has widened its activities with long-term, project based ones, starting the implementation of a capacity assessment and building project focused on Afghanistan. The project entitled "Achieving the MDGs through Peacebuilding: Capacity building in transition to democracy, community based-dialogue and peacekeeping operations for international, national and local actors in Afghanistan" aims at identifying peacebuilding and peacemaking capacity building needs, achievements and lessons learned of local, national and international actors working in Afghanistan, so to offer policy recommendations and operational support for locally and nationally owned, evidence based, and demand-based capacity building programmes aiding a peaceful transition and sustainable MDG achievement. The project is implemented in partnership with the Kabul-based Cooperation for Peace and Unity (CPAU), and with the financial support of the Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, from the Official Development Assistance budget, and UNDP Bratislava Regional Center.

The achievements of IPDTC for the past year would have not been possible without the dedicated group of staff and interns implementing the daily activities of the Center. The 2-member staff was completed during the last 12 months with 3 interns, each focusing on designated strategic activity areas: training coordination, fundraising and research.

2013 ACHIEVEMENTS

- 132 individuals were trained through 7 capacity building programs online (Operational Peace Support System) and on-site (both in Romania and worldwide)
- 5 training sites were used for training, capacity building implementation: Cluj-Napoca, Romania; London, UK; Istanbul, Turkey; Mexico and Nepal
- One 12-months project funded under the title "Achieving the MDGs through Peacebuilding: Capacity building in transition to democracy, community based-dialogue and peacekeeping operations for international, national and local actors in Afghanistan"
- 1 institutional cooperation implemented with the Bonn-based ForumZFD for delivery of training expertise on the topic of "Designing Peacebuilding Programmes"
- Launch of Global OPS, in cooperation with PATRIR's Department of Peace Operations (DPO), an online platform to provide high quality customised support for agencies, experts, practitioners and policy-makers engaged in conflict areas through real-time, targeted and tailored assistance
- 3 new interns were added to the IPDTC team

DEPD - Department of Education for Peace and Development

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Education for Peace and Development is mainly present in local programs in Cluj-Napoca, Romania, but is also active in national and international youth engagements related to peacebuilding and conflict transformation, and formal and non-formal peace education.

2013 has been a challenging but also fruitful year for us. Locally we've managed to consolidate our youth engagements on the topics of peace education, multiculturalism and diversity. We have taken forward our work in schools, focused on preventing and combating schools violence with the Peace Education Program in schools from Cluj-Napoca (Romania), we have organized the 4th edition of the Celebrating Diversity and Multiculturalism Seminar for youth in Cluj, with the participation of some our international partners and we hosted international volunteers for internship stages with PATRIR.

Internationally we have strengthened our partnerships with youth NGOs from Spain, Norway, the Netherlands, Slovakia, the Czech Republic, Moldova, Turkey, Ukraine, Georgia, Albania, Germany, Italy, Austria, Poland and UK through study visits, youth exchanges, training courses and research related to peacebuilding and development issues.

The greater part of the work done by DEPD was made by volunteers and interns, this being sometimes a challenge in terms of securing continuity and sustainability for all engagements. However, their contribution, dedication and commitment are highly appreciated and are a proof that civil society organization working on grass-root level can provide a solid and relevant work experience to students or newly graduates.



2013 ACHIEVEMENTS

- We have worked with over 1.000 students and young people, 70 teachers coming from 10 schools based in Cluj-Napoca providing workshops and interactive tools meant to prevent and combat school violence, promote nonviolent communication and conflict transformation in the local community.
- We have offered the chance to more than 50 young activists from Romania to take part in 16 international youth exchanges, study visits or training courses all over the EU and neighbouring countries.
- We've strengthened our institutional and organizational relations and partnerships with local authorities from Romania and mostly youth organizations from across Europe.

DPO - Department of Peace Operations

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Peace Operations is a leading center of expertise providing global upon-request support for peacebuilding, armed conflict and violence prevention, and peace consolidation.

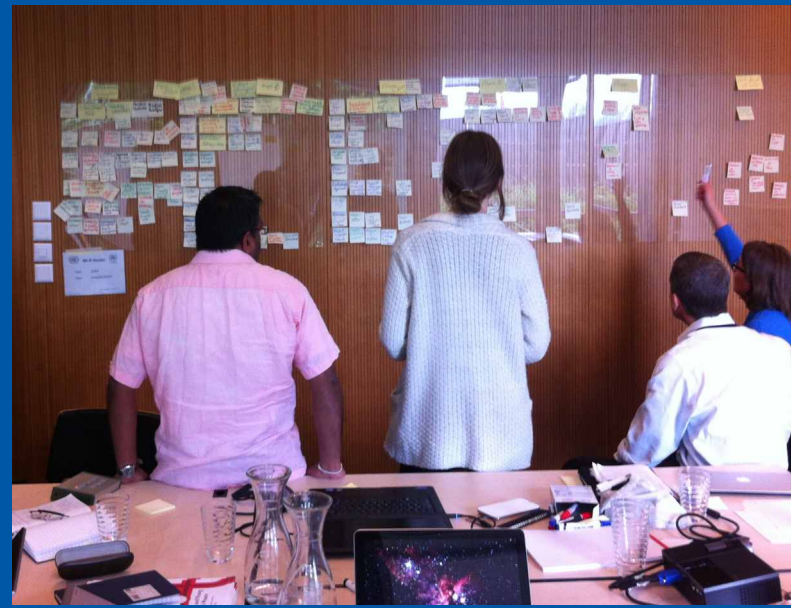
DPO's mission is: to make peacebuilding and prevention work - improving local, national and global capacities to address conflicts constructively and effectively, prevent armed conflicts and violence, and improve lasting and sustainable peace and peace consolidation.

In 2013 the Department took on major engagements globally. In Lebanon the Department was requested by UNDP Lebanon and national partners to support NGOs working on creating a national network to address reconciliation and healing in Lebanon. This included a series of trainings as well as training and support for the UNDP country office in Lebanon. In Nepal DPO worked upon request from GIZ to strengthen the role of ex-combatants and youth in the peace process. This included workshops with community leaders, youth, ex-combatants and media across Nepal as well as training and support for GIZ staff. DPO also facilitated a 5-days strategic planning retreat for staff from IKV Pax Christi and partner organisations from Georgia-Abkhazia-South Ossetia and Armenia-Azerbaijan-Nagorno Karabakh to support and strengthen civil society strategic peacebuilding capabilities in the region. In Mexico DPO provided workshops and training to hundreds of participants across the country on prevention and peacebuilding.

The Crimea Policy Dialogue project continued generating, advocating & supporting the implementation of policy initiatives aimed at stabilising inter-ethnic relations in Crimea and reducing the risk of intra-Crimea conflict escalation. A pilot project was launched in the education system, aimed at introducing multilingual education as an alternative system to Crimean kindergartens and primary schools, using international experience and based on the consensus recommendation of dialogue participants from all major ethno-political groups of Crimea and experts from Kyiv. A dialogue of historians developed throughout 2013, being a unique platform for Crimea, aimed at reducing the potential of competing historical narratives being used for politically divisive purposes. A new strand of the project was launched focused on unlocking the development potential of multicultural towns in Crimea, building the capacity of local authorities & communities to view multiculturalism as a resource rather than a risk. The core dialogue group of the project began strategic planning of sustainable functioning as a dialogue platform beyond the scope of project funding and PATRIR facilitation.

The Department also took on major pieces of work internationally on supporting collaborative leadership in post-war recovery and peace consolidation and monitoring and evaluation of the civilian component of peace operations. DPO also prioritised engagement on prevention of armed conflict and armed violence with special focus on prevention of electoral violence, and is an active member of the Global Partnership for the Prevention of Armed Conflict's working group on prevention, as well as of the Global Alliance on Armed Violence Prevention and Reduction (GAAV). DPO also continues its engagement in support of infrastructure for peace as a key area to strengthen real local, national, regional and international capabilities for peacebuilding and prevention. To this end the Department is also a member of the International Network on Infrastructure for Peace (I4P). In cooperation with Save the Children International, World Vision International, Search for Common Ground, UNOY Peacebuilders, the Commonwealth Youth Programme and a range of UN agencies DPO assisted in the establishment of the Global Partnership on Children and Youth Participation in Peacebuilding and preparations for the launch in 2014 of a Global Movement on children, youth and peacebuilding.

In 2013 the DPO launched a major innovation in peacebuilding with the creation of GlobalOPS Global Operational Peace Support an on-line platform to provide direct, real-time coaching, training and technical assistance for experts and professionals in the field.



2013 ACHIEVEMENTS

- Empowerment Programmes for more than 300 youth peace workers and 30 youth community leaders in Nepal leading to the creation of Youth Peace Councils in 5 districts across Nepal and increase in community-based mediation and awareness raising programmes;
- 3-Trainings and Technical Assistance Support Programmes for 20 middle to senior peaceworkers in Lebanon supporting the working of the national network on reconciliation and strengthening confidence building in support of direct engagement in conflict transformation and peacebuilding efforts
- Technical Assistance and support to the UNDP Lebanon country team to improve integration of peacebuilding and prevention into their work
- 24+ key NGO leaders and civil society activists from Georgia-Abkhazia-South Ossetia and Armenia-Azerbaijan-Nagorno Karabakh trained and supported to develop effective peacebuilding strategies
- More than 100 people trained from NGOs, media, government, academia and business sector in Mexico and strengthening capacity of key national peacebuilding initiative
- Creation of a major breakthrough in the peacebuilding field to bring direct real-time support to practitioners and policy makers in the field
- A consortium was created at DPO's initiative to launch the first ever multi-country, multi-agency, multi-donor evaluation of children, youth and peacebuilding. Initial funding was received and the 3M Evaluation will be implemented in 2014-2015
- A StartUp! Team was initiated to launch a multi-year major global movement of millions of children and youth to lead to the creation of a UN resolution on children, youth and peacebuilding
- Within the Crimea Policy Dialogue project, 8 dialogue meetings of the core dialogue group were held, 5 public events were organised in Crimea focused on dialogue of historians and development of multicultural towns, 2 analytical publications were released, 2 international study tours were held focused on multilingual education as well as 8 capacity building workshops for educators, journalists, local authorities and an international conference were organised in Crimea focused on historical reconciliation experiences.

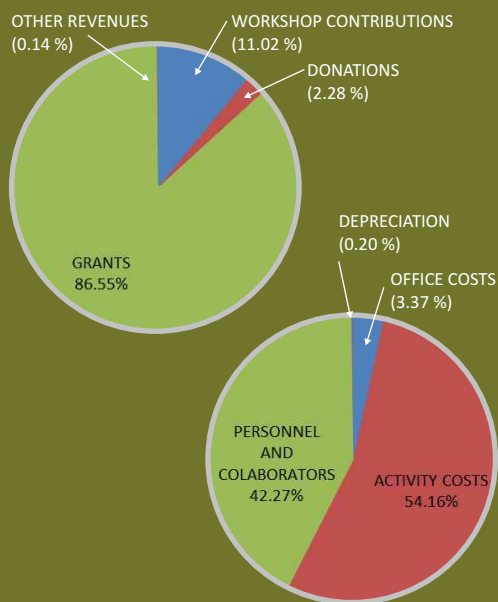
GOALS FOR 2014

- To launch the Global Movement for Children, Youth and Peacebuilding world-wide and recruit at least 10.000 individual members and 1000 supporting organisations in 100 countries by September 21st 2014
- To implement the 3M Multi-Country, Multi-Agency Evaluation of Children, Youth and Peacebuilding Programmes in partnership with Save the Children, Search for Common Ground, World Vision International and UNOY Peacebuilders in Nepal, Colombia and the Democratic Republic of the Congo
- To make a significant contribution to peacebuilding and peace support operations in at least two conflict areas - responding to requests from partners, agencies, and governments for DPO support
- To provide organisational development and improving peacebuilding impact support to at least two major organisations / agencies in the field, continuing DPO's pioneering work in assisting organisations, agencies and governments to improve the impact, quality and effectiveness of their peacebuilding and peace support operations
- To develop at least two pioneering 'state of the field' handbooks on key areas of peacebuilding and conflict transformation to improve the state of knowledge, policy and practice in the field
- To provide support to at least 100 practitioners and policy makers through GlobalOPS online Operational Peace Support - assisting practitioners and policy makers in the field
- To continue and deepen DPOs work in key practice areas, including: infrastructure for peace; prevention of armed violence and armed conflict; mediation and facilitation of peace processes; and reconciliation and healing after violence
